My poor mental capacity doesn't allow me to write a letter worthy of yours, but accept the few words which express to you the gratitude of my heart for your words of comfort which you wanted to send me.

Yes, oh dear friend, this is a grave moment for me, because in these days the sister who I unfortunately never appreciated as much as in these days when she is far from me has left home. The struggle is hard, but it is also necessary to overcome and to find again our little road to Damascus so that we can march along it toward the Goal which we all should attain . . . Certainly the faith is still the sole anchor of salvation to which we must grasp strongly: without it what would our whole life be? It would be spent uselessly because in the world there is only sorrow, and sorrow without faith is unbearable, while sorrow nourished by the torch of the faith becomes a beautiful thing because it fortifies the soul in its struggles. CCC 291. What is required to receive Holy Communion?

To receive Holy Communion one must be fully incorporated into the Catholic Church and be in the state of grace, that is, not conscious of being in mortal sin. Anyone who is conscious of having committed a grave sin must first receive the sacrament of Reconciliation before going to Communion. Also important for those receiving Holy Communion are a spirit of recollection and prayer, observance of the fast prescribed by the Church, and an appropriate disposition of the body (gestures and dress) as a sign of respect for Christ.


